*1) Minutes - Exec. Comm. Meeting- Casablanca, Morocco, January.15-18/2011
(Secretary-General Heitor Gurgulino)*

A motion to approve minutes was made and seconded; minutes for the Casablanca Executive Committee meeting were approved unanimously without amendment.

2) Recognition for Contributions with the 2008-2011 Executive Committee Meetings and IAUP President Emeritus Pornchai Mongkhonvanit (President Barham Madain)

President Barham Madain commended IAUP President Emeritus Pornchai Mongkhonvanit for his contributions with ACADEME and his past IAUP Presidency, along with the hosts of the 2008-11 Executive Committee meetings, which included:

Casablanca, Morocco: Former President Mohammed Barkaoui and President Khalid Naciri of the University Hassan II

Tokyo, Japan: President Toyoshi Satow of the J.F. Oberlin University and President Ichiro Tanioka of the Osaka University of Commerce

Rio de Janeiro, Brazil: Professor Paulo Alcantara Gomes, Rector of Universidade Castelo Branco, and Carlos Alberto Serpa de Oliveira, President of Fundacao Cesgranrio

Alexandria, Egypt: Mr. Enan Galaly, member of the IAUP Council of Senior Advisors

3) Treasurer's Interim Report (Treasurer Jose Rodriguez)

The treasurer's report indicated that approximately \$322,000 in general operating funds were being held in Chile for transfer to the new leadership in the USA.

4) Texts of Draft Resolutions for the IAUP General Assembly on June 20, 2011 (Heitor Gurgulino and Richard Bronson)

Five resolutions were read, considered, moved, seconded, and approved without amendment.

- a) The Executive Committee resolved: "THAT the form of byelaws circulated to the meeting be noted with approval and such approval communicated to the General Assembly members; and THAT the form of Articles of Association circulated to the meeting be noted with approval and such approval communicated to the General Assembly members." These byelaws and Articles of Association become the governing documents of the IAUP Charity.
- b) The Executive Committee approved a motion to be subsequently considered by the General Assembly concerning the incorporation of IAUP as a not-for-profit Charity in the UK: "The Board of the Charity and the new IAUP Executive Committee, during the Triennium 2011-2014 are hereby authorized by the General Assembly of the IAUP in New York City, on June 20, 2011, to take all other necessary actions to fully complete the process."
- c) The Executive Committee approved a motion to be subsequently considered by the General Assembly: "THAT the purposes of the Association would be best achieved through the transfer of all of the assets of the Association to the Incorporated Charity, by way of charitable application, and the Association thereafter be wound up and all future activities be undertaken exclusively through the Incorporated Charity, and therefore, on the basis that the Association has no contractual or other liabilities and no assets other than cash at bank, to approve in principle the irrevocable transfer of all of the assets of the Association (by bank transfer or otherwise) to the Incorporated Charity, the IAUP General Assembly, held in New York City, on June 20, 2011 authorizes the Board and the Executive Committee to take any step necessary to effect such transfer and winding up."
- d) Executive Committee approved a motion to be subsequently approved by the General Assembly, confirming the prior election of the Officers and ratifying the election the Officers Elect of the IAUP to serve for the triennium 2011-2014:

International Association of University Presidents ('the Association')

Executive Committee Resolution wording

(To be included at the meeting of 17 June 2011)

Background

1. The meeting was reminded that the incorporation of a company called 'International Association of University Presidents' ('the Incorporated Charity') had been promoted by the Association in England and Wales to continue its work and activities in corporate form.

Transfer of Assets

2. The Executive Committee noted that the General Assembly of the Association had previously resolved on 2 October 2008 to authorise the Executive Committee of the Association to wind up the Association after all of its assets and liabilities had been transferred to the Incorporated Charity.
3. Bearing in mind the passage of time and the delay experienced with the registration of the Incorporated Charity with the Charity Commission for England and Wales, the Executive Committee resolved at its meeting on 15 January 2011 in Casablanca to propose the issue once again to the General Assembly for confirmation at its next Triennial General Assembly meeting.
4. The Executive Committee, in anticipation of the upcoming Triennial General Assembly meeting on 20 June 2011 in New York, confirmed that it would again propose to the General Assembly that all of the assets of the Association be irrevocably transferred (by bank transfer or otherwise) to the Incorporated Charity and the Association thereafter be wound up and all future activities be undertaken exclusively through the Incorporated Charity.

Governing Documents – Articles of Association and Byelaws

5. The Executive Committee noted that a set of byelaws for the Incorporated Charity had been prepared to reflect the terms of the Association's Charter and had been duly considered by the Executive Committee in April 2011.
6. The Executive Committee further noted that amended Articles of Association of the Incorporated Charity had been prepared to reflect a simplified governance structure such that, for the purpose of administrative ease, the formal governing body of the Incorporated Charity would be limited to the Officers, Officers-Elect and Former Officers only. The Regional Chairs would form a committee reporting back to this new Board of Directors and therefore maintain a role in the governance of the Incorporated Charity. A new 'Executive Committee' would be established to have an advisory capacity in respect of the new Board of Directors/

Resolutions

7. The Executive committee resolved:
 - 7.1 **THAT** the form of byelaws circulated to the meeting be noted with approval and such approval communicated to the General Assembly members; and
 - 7.2 **THAT** the form of Articles of Association circulated to the meeting be noted with approval and such approval communicated to the General Assembly members.

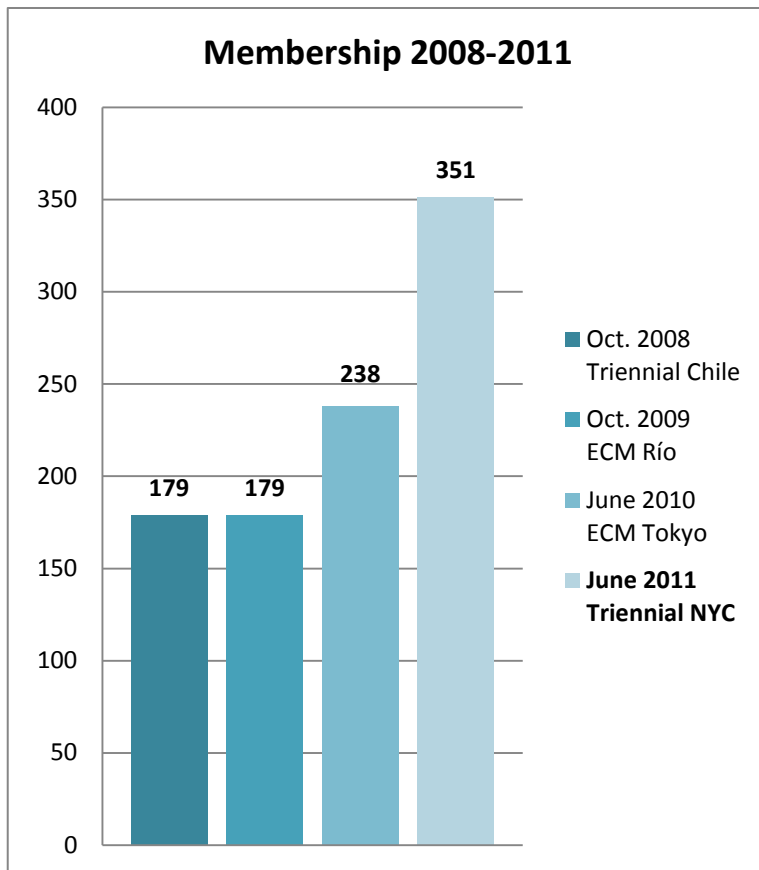

Membership by Region

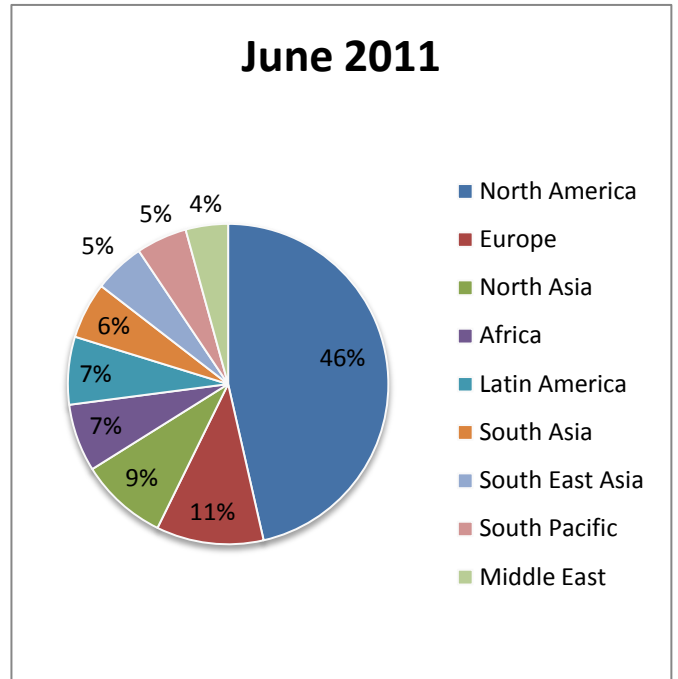
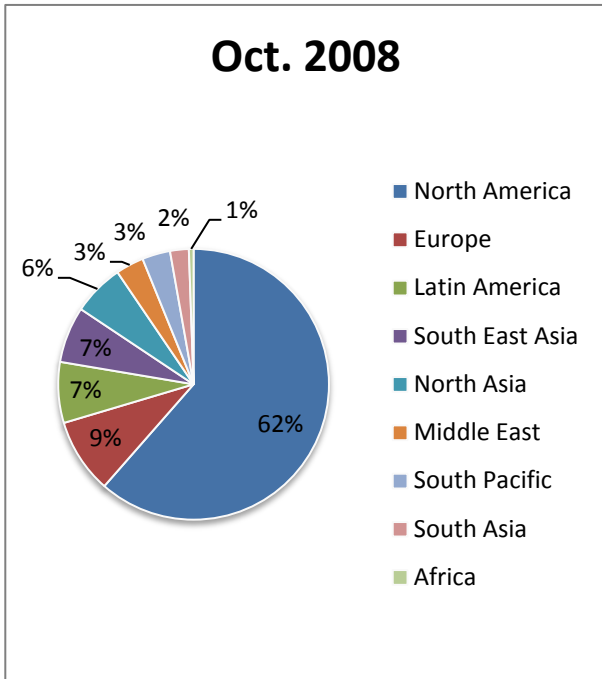
